



## Scripture of the Week



"The people were astonished at His teaching, for He taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes." (Mark 1:22)

It is the Sabbath and Jesus is exactly where a devout Jewish man should be, in the synagogue. And, as He does so well, Jesus is teaching those who have gathered. We enter the story as He has wrapped up His teaching and the people gathered know they are hearing something out of the ordinary - "having authority and not as the scribes."

Their world is about to get shaken even further when a man with an "unclean spirit" reacts to Jesus's teaching and cries out "I know who you are - the Holy One of God!" Jesus responds by calling the unclean spirit out of the man, and the spirit does as Jesus commands. The people gathered are amazed that the unclean spirit obeys Jesus. But they need not be amazed; the unclean spirit itself announced exactly who Jesus is -"the Holy One of God." Can we hear that proclamation and believe?
