Learn How to Un-Hurry This Lent

Maybe you've heard (most likely it was me talking your ear off about it) but Holy Name of Jesus is starting over 30 new small groups during Lent! I won't get into all the details but our church has been working for the last 10 years to develop and grow a vibrant small group ministry. In the last 14 months, every parish in the Archdiocese set out to do the same, after consensus from participants in the Archdiocesan Synod and the guidance of Archbishop Hebda. We're moving into the next stage (actually forming small groups!) and I'm so excited to be partaking in it with you.

Under the direction of Fr. Wratkowski we have decided to all study the same topic together – a curriculum based on *"The Ruthless Elimination of Hurry"* by John Mark Comer. This book is a teaching moment on how to reclaim what has been stolen from our lives by excessive technology use, busy-ness, the grind, the hustle - you name it. Comer invites us to reclaim "apprenticeship" with our Lord. Not simply going through the motions under the obligation of the law, but rather joyful, real, Christ-like living. He proposes another way.

We will spend a week discussing the problem (trust me, the statistics on how much we hurry are sobering) followed by four weeks of Gospel-proven practices. Notice I didn't say "solutions." The way of Jesus is not a silver bullet but a way of life so that's what the topics will be focused on. Silence and solitude, Sabbath, slowing and simplicity. Lots of "S"s.

If you think this sounds lame and it's not for you...it's probably for you. This is an opportunity to meet fellow Catholics who are striving for the same thing: holiness. It's the opportunity to try something new (remember, it's only six weeks!). If you're struggling with the expectations of life and what it means to follow our Lord – what better time than Lent!? (You don't even need to read or purchase the book since the small group will guide us through all of the principles of the book).

I pray you will not only join me, but our whole parish and our whole archdiocese on this journey this Lent. If

This year, we have two featured speakers, Annie Grandell and Sister Amelia, O.P.

Annie Grandell, YDisciple Director at NET Ministries, has over two decades of experience working with youth. She started as a NET Missionary herself in 2001, then served as a Youth Minister for nearly 12 years after earning a



degree in Catholic Studies from the University of St. Thomas. She is now creating programs, strategies and content for youth ministry leaders through YDisciple. Steubenville, Open to 8th-12th Graders

We are headed to Steubenville St. Paul, July 26-28.

Steubenville is a weekend-long Catholic youth conference. Music, speakers, entertainment, small groups, Eucharistic Adoration and more. (Actually, it's kinda like a weekend-long concert with friends.)

The conference is held in St. Paul, MN at the University of St. Thomas. We will be staying in dorms at the University. The conference is open to all current 8th-12th grade students. The weekend is chaperoned by staff and volunteers from HNOJ. All have been background checked and have received Virtus training.

Cost is \$295 (if paid on or before April 3), or \$335 after April 3. This covers the cost of the weekend, t-shirt, dorm and bus transportation. Scholarships are available. Note: No refunds can be given after May 15.

Beware of Scams

It has come to our attention that there are phishing scams circulating, attempting to exploit the trust and generosity within our community. Please be vigilant and cautious when receiving any emails, messages or requests that seem suspicious or unfamiliar, especially those seeking personal information or financial contributions. Always remember that Fr Wratkowski, Fr. Mike Reinhardt and anyone else from the parish office or school will never email you asking for money, gift cards, social security numbers or other personal information.

Here are a few tips to ensure your online security:

Nothing is urgent: Phishing emails like to make you feel like you have to act now. Don't fall for it, nothing in an email or text is urgent. You have plenty of time to follow all the tips below.

Check the sender's email address closely: All parish employees' emails end with

@hnoj.org. If the email address is for example pastortim@gmail it is not from HNOJ and not to be trusted. Email addresses can be one letter off as well, such as generalmlls instead of generalmills. They are tricky!

Do NOT click links: The 'bad guys' have learned to create real looking emails and even websites, making it hard to decipher if this one is really from your bank or from a bad guy. Make it a habit to go to the website directly. If it says click here for your account information, go to a website as you normally would and log in. if it states click here to donate to HNOJ, go to hnoj.org/give instead.

Cross-check requests: Call the church office or business to verify authenticity of an email request. If you were not expecting an email with an attachment from your friend or colleague, give them a call to see if they sent it.

Update security software: Ensure your computer and devices have up-to-date antivirus/anti-malware software and software updates to provide an additional layer of protection.

What to do if you suspect an email or text is pretending to be from Holy Name of Jesus:

- Forward the email or a screenshot of the text to Michelle Hudlow, mhudlow@hnoj.org, so we can be aware and act accordingly.
- You can report it to the FTC by going to their website, ftc.gov, and click on report fraud. While you are there you can sign up for their consumer alerts to be in the know about new scams.
- In your email software, mark it as junk. This should also send feedback to your mail server so they can be aware.
- Most importantly, just delete it.

Your safety and security are of the utmost importance to us. If you ever have concerns or questions about the legitimacy of any communication purportedly from Holy Name of Jesus, please do not hesitate to contact our parish office directly.
