Don't be a Naaman!

The story we heard at Mass this past Monday about the Syrian general Naaman (2 Kings 5) strikes me as very timely. He was a high-ranking man who suffered from leprosy and who traveled south into Israel to seek a cure. He brought a lot of gold and silver with him to talk with the king of Israel, and Naaman was prepared to get a cure worthy of his high station. The king was at a loss, and the prophet Elisha invited Naaman to come to him. When Naaman arrives, he is instructed to bathe in the Jordan, where he will be healed. Naaman is quite indignant, and had to be persuaded by one of his servants to try such a lowly and simple cure. He goes to the Jordan to bathe and he is cured.

Naaman wanted an extraordinary cure, and he was prepared to pay quite a lot of money for it. What was effective was to listen to Elisha and to be willing to do something quite simple.

It probably is not too hard for most of us to find more Naaman in ourselves than we care to admit. A fancy new car catches our eye, and we think if only we had that. Or we get into our head that that new diet based on the latest medical science is exactly what will turn our lives around. Or if we found that perfect book for spiritual reading during Lent, our faith life would be so much better. We want the extraordinary. That is what so often occupies our mindshare, our hopes and our dreams.

But much more often God offers us the ordinary. Exercise regularly, eat fruits and veggies, show up every day in prayer. I'm struck by how much of what we are learning in our Lenten small groups is the ordinary. It's well presented and well articulated, but it's nothing new. It's nothing extraordinary. Notice your impatience, workaholism, numbness or whatever symptoms of hurry you may have. Practice silence, solitude, simplicity. Rest with God and worship Him on the Sabbath. Sit with God in prayer. Share your journey with others. Let them share with you. Slow down to the pace of Jesus. None of these are extraordinary practices. They are small, ordinary practices or habits of being.

But the ordinary, tried sincerely, tried with patience and perseverance (don't worry about perfection!), done with some thoughtfulness, **the ordinary leads to the extraordinary**. To Naaman, nothing could be more red-neck country than a dip in the Jordan. And yet when he was willing to listen to Elisha and to do it, it cured him of leprosy. To many of us, these small things being suggested to us seem to be too small to make any difference to the big troubles of our lives. And yet the experience of those living life at the pace of Jesus, with his cadence of active life and prayerful silence is an experience of great richness, meaning and joy. If it is a secret, it is only because we choose not to look.

This is our invitation this Lent. Don't be a Naaman! It is not too late to start to take a dip in the waters of the Jordan (so to speak) and experience great spiritual fruit!



Scripture of the Week




"For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not from you; it is the gift of God" (Ephesians 2:8)
