## Ascension Outreach

Longtime HNOJ parishioner, Larry Deeney, is quick to describe how he feels about volunteering at Ascension Catholic School in North Minneapolis. "I love the energy that emanates from the place the moment I walk into the building," says Deeney. "The young scholars are so vibrant and active. Sometimes it's tough to get them to focus, but they really want to learn."

Deeney and his wife, Cathy, have volunteered at Ascension Catholic School since 2021. He recalls returning to Ascension after being gone for a few months one winter. "I walked up the steps into the school hallway, and the scholars happened to be in the hall on a bathroom break. They screamed out 'Mr. Deeney' and came running over to me and gave me hugs. I felt so appreciated; it was awesome!"

Deeney describes the 30-plus year relationship between Ascension and HNOJ as symbiotic. "It helps both parish communities. True discipleship is cross-cultural. And I believe that we can grow more like Christ as we connect with people who, on the surface, appear different from us."

### Ascension Catholic School - A Beacon of Hope

Ascension Catholic School, an important presence in North Minneapolis for more than 125 years, helps move lives forward through education and spiritual formation.

Currently, 96% of the 313 scholars at Ascension Catholic School are children of color; 81% meet federal guidelines to qualify for free or reduced lunch, which is a marker for poverty; and 13% are learning to speak English as a second language. For the past several years, nearly 100% of Ascension 8th graders have received their high school diplomas in four years, with a vast majority going on to college.

Our partnership helps build on Ascension's past success. In fact, 95% of Ascension's general operating revenue is generated through sponsorships, individual donations, grant funding and second collection efforts. Roughly 4% comes from tuition and fees paid by families.

It is unknown at the time of writing how many are to continue; regardless, the Lord has blessed us with a strong foundation with which to grow this part of the parish. Again, thank you to all our leaders! A few notes on the success of this mission:

### The Groups

A common theme I heard from participants was how much fun they had with their group or how it was exactly the small community they were looking for. We can overemphasize communal events and underemphasize the desire for authentic friendship with other Christ-oriented people. I heard a story of a woman who felt a lack of meaningful community and was about to walk out the front door for the last time. Until she was redirected to join a small group by Fr. Mike! This story stresses the need for more than just donuts after Mass (and you all know how much I love donuts) as Catholics are searching for meaningful friendships within our own walls. Small Groups are part of the answer to that.

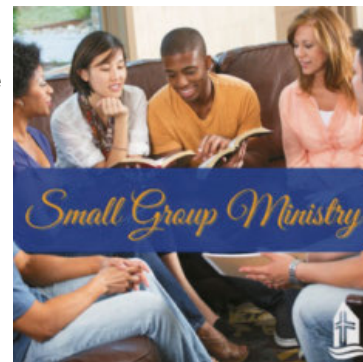
### The Content

The focus of these groups went beyond curriculum as they encompassed the whole Christian life. They shared the joys and difficulties of life, prayed with and for one another and accompanied each other in our parish's common task of "Ruthlessly Eliminating Hurry." In the content, they practiced this through John Mark Comer's four foundations of Silence/Solitude, Sabbath, Simplicity and Slowing. We heard incredible feedback about how the Lord spoke to participants through the content about their need and desire to slow and simplify their lives.

## Why is the Door Locked?

In recent weeks, you may have noticed some changes around Holy Name of Jesus aimed at enhancing our security measures. Some of these measures are invisible to most parishioners and maybe even staff. Others beg the question - Why?

Despite being located in a relatively safe neighborhood, Holy Name of Jesus faced a security incident several years ago when an attempted break-in occurred at our offices. In response, we installed cameras and upgraded certain locks, leading to fewer security incidents since then. However, with reports of crime in nearby areas, our leadership has taken proactive measures to further enhance the security of our facilities for the safety of our large parish family, especially during school hours and on Faith Formation nights when children are present.



### *Investing in Our Safety:*

**Controlled Access:** Card readers have been installed at various entrances, allowing us to monitor and regulate who enters our facilities.

**Automated Door Schedules:** By implementing automated door schedules, a consistent level of security is maintained, even when personnel may not be readily available.

**Video Intercom System:** The newly installed video intercom system at the main entrance serves as an added security feature, enabling individuals to be verified before having access to our facilities. Should you find yourself arriving early on weekends to for a setup or running late to pick up your child during Faith Formation nights, we kindly ask that you utilize the intercom system located at Door 1. Rest assured; someone will be available to respond to your call until 9 p.m. Your safety and peace of mind are our top priorities.

These investments are just the beginning of HNOJ's efforts to prioritize safety within the parish. As we continue to explore ways to enhance security, reduce risks and insurance premiums, we appreciate your help in maintaining a secure environment for all.

### *What can you do?*

**Lock Doors:** Remember to lock meeting room doors behind you and avoid propping any door open to prevent unauthorized access.

**Stay Vigilant:** Be aware of your surroundings and report any suspicious activity to parish staff or security personnel. If someone is climbing on the roof or doing 'donuts' in the parking lot, call the non-emergency Medina police number 952-258-5321.

**Have a key?:** If you currently have a Door 1 key, consider turning it in or exchanging it for a key fob for added convenience and security.

### *Looking Ahead:*

In the coming months, the plan is to further improve security with the installation of exterior cameras and enhanced lighting in the parking lot. As we navigate these changes, your patience is greatly appreciated.

### *Your Feedback Matters:*

We understand that these changes may feel different from how things have always been done in the past. We value your feedback and encourage you to reach out to Janna Webskowski, Parish Administrator, or Jeff Ruchti, Facilities and Maintenance Manager, with any questions or concerns regarding our security measures. Together, we can work towards creating a safer and more secure environment for our entire parish community.

Our mission trip will take place June 9-15. This summer, we have room for 20 students and five adults to participate in the mission trip. Students currently in 8th to 12th grade are encouraged to register and participate in this service opportunity.

Some of the work we will be doing includes but is not limited to:

- Repairing and building homes
- Painting
- House cleaning
- Yard work
- Basic construction projects
- Helping at daycare centers
- Working in homeless shelters
- Volunteering at food pantries

What is the cost of the mission trip?

This year's fee is \$750 which includes the housing and food cost for CHWC, hotel stay for Friday night and a t-shirt. It does not include the cost of transportation as we will be fundraising to cover this cost. Our goal is to rent seven-passenger minivans to get to Champaign. We will also stop at a waterpark on our way home to Minnesota!

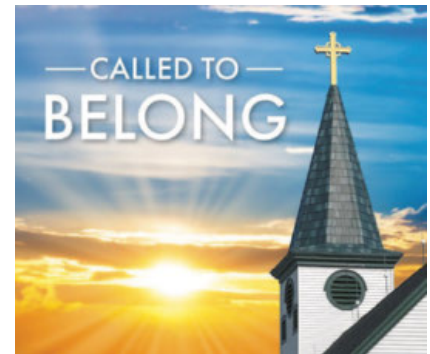
