The Gift of the Sacrament of the Eucharist

We had a training for Eucharistic Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC) this past Sunday. It was beautiful to see people step up and decide to be a part of this ministry. There were EMHCs who just wanted a refresher as we begin to offer the Most Precious Blood once more at the 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. Masses this Easter season. There were people who had stepped away from the ministry some time ago who decided to



come back to serve. And then there were people who responded to the invitation to join this ministry for the first time.

Much of the training covered the logistical aspect of the Eucharistic ministers receiving the Body and Blood themselves, and, in turn, offering Jesus to the congregation. But there are also opportunities for deeper formation. For example, it has been an important lesson in my own formation to remember that Eucharist is always received, never taken. The logic of receiving and never taking becomes clear when we recall that it is Jesus Himself, obscured under the signs of bread and wine. Jesus is offering Himself as a free gift so that we can grow closer to Him. Gifts are never taken, always received, and how much more so with Jesus. Recognizing our Sacrament of the Eucharist as a gift of Jesus invites us into a posture of receptivity and reverence. We approach the Eucharist reverently first of all because it is Christ Himself.

A second, more subtle reason to approach the Eucharist with all reverence and respect is that it is an opportunity for deeper conversion, a school for the heart if you will. Each of us are flesh and spirit deeply integrated into a single person. Just as the act of lifting up the corners of ones mouth into a smile raises the spirits (or at least creates an opening in that direction), so too with our physical posture before Christ. As we come before Him with a bow, with our tongue extended for reception or with our hands cupped into a throne to receive Him, that physical posture is a nudge or an invitation to our souls to receive Him more reverently mentally and spiritually. This is because our flesh, our mind and our spirit want to be in harmony with each other. This is something I'm sure most of you already know on some level, but it is worth putting on paper as a reminder.

I was also asked, after the training, what is the difference in receiving Jesus in both species. After all, Jesus is present in His entirety in each particle of consecrated bread or drop of consecrated wine. And it is absolutely true: you don't get more Jesus. What you get is a more complete sign. When we receive Jesus, who offered His Body and Blood for us, in both His Body and Blood, it can be a fuller sign to us and thus lead us towards a more complete receptivity towards Him.





Scripture of the Week




"See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God." (1John 3:1)
