For many high school seniors, the day year books are distributed is a big deal. People page through looking at a year full of memories. Funny pictures from events, dances and normal school days breakup pages of quotes, news stories and all school polls. Each senior is highlighted with a senior picture in someway and school pride is on display.

At some schools, having fellow students sign the year book is precious particularly for graduating seniors. They make inside jokes, write compliments and eagerly sign their name in the yearbooks of close friends and mere acquaintances alike.

In movies and TV shows we see a common line written by at least one character to another, "You're the best - Don't ever change."

What an insult. Sure, the sentiment might be, "you're awesome and I like you just this way." But the reality is to tell someone to "never change" is like saying to them, "I think you've already peaked and I can't imagine you getting any better." Can you imagine telling someone, "Right now is the best you will ever be." Ouch.

Some of these changes are challenging and other good, but all signal a change from the way it used to be.

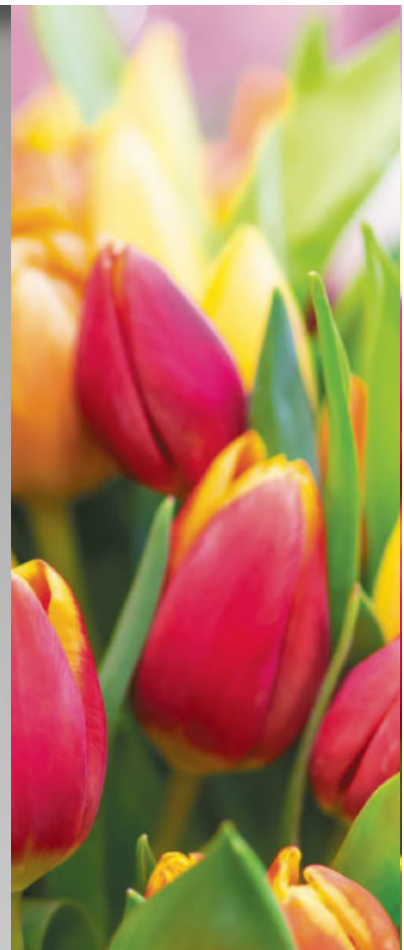

Saint John Henry Newman once said, "To live is to change, and to be perfect is to change often."

We can be uncomfortable with change. It can be hard to say goodbye to people and ministries, both of which inspired us and helped us know God. However, if we are open to it, God wants to change us. He wants us to grow and move and change. God loves us so much, he invites us to more and that more is beyond anything we can imagine for ourselves.

Let's celebrate the changes this past ministry year knowing that they are inviting us to greater holiness and God is with us through every single one.

Catholic Movie Series

***Shoes of the Fisherman* (an old Catholic classic)**

On Wednesday, June 19, we'll be showing an epic Novel turned movie about the rise of an Eastern Catholic Pope and his response to a world marred by famine, politics and the fear of nuclear war.

***A Quiet Place* (a contemporary movie with Catholic themes)**

On Wednesday, July 10, we'll be showing a movie about a family surviving the collapse of civilization through silence and trust in one another. They use sign language to communicate and develop monastic habits to make it through another day in a world rife with danger.

***The Scarlet and the Black* (another old Catholic classic)**

On Wednesday, Aug. 14, we'll be showing a true story of a heroic priest who hid everyone from Jews to Allied POWs during the Nazi occupation of Rome. Starring Gregory Peck and Christopher Plummer who depict the priest and the Nazi antagonist.

It explores the state of the modern world, and the strengths and weaknesses of the contemporary religious scene, by taking his central character, Father Elijah Schafer, a Carmelite priest, on a secret mission for the Vatican which embroils him in a series of crises and subterfuges affecting the ultimate destiny of the Church.

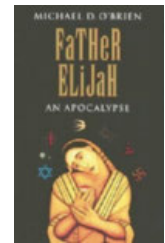
In this richly textured tale, Father Elijah crosses Europe and the Middle East, moves through the echelons of world power, meets saints and sinners, presidents, judges, mystics, embattled Catholic journalists, faithful priests and a conspiracy of traitors within the very House of God. This is an apocalypse in the old literary sense, but one that was written in the light of Christian revelation.

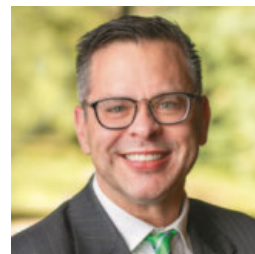
