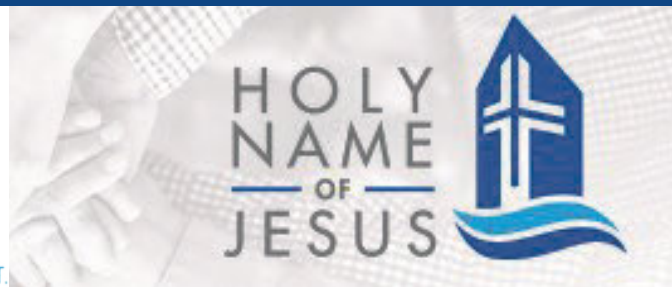

"Behold, I am doing a new thing!"

Pentecost is the culmination of Jesus's work here on earth. We think of Christmas and Easter as the two big holy days of the year, in large part because we make them big holidays. Pentecost is no less significant. God came to us in the flesh to prepare the way for us to come to Him. This involves the perfect sacrifice for our sins on Good Friday. It involves the defeat of death in the resurrection on Easter Sunday. But by themselves, those wondrous events are not enough. They are not enough because by ourselves we cannot follow Jesus. We cannot by ourselves follow Jesus on the cross. We cannot by ourselves follow Jesus through death to new life.



Nor are we meant to! Jesus by Himself did not save us. He emptied Himself, becoming obedient to the point of death. He relied on His Father. He relied on their mutual love, the Spirit that proceeds from them both, the Holy Spirit, whom He shares with His church at Pentecost.

Jesus gives us the same means by which He saved us. And the means is not a thing, not merely a power, but a person, the third person of the trinity, whom He sends to dwell in our hearts and by which He makes us one with Him.

The outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Church, which began at Pentecost continues today! It continues through the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. It continues as we pray, "Come, Holy Spirit!" Jesus continues to pour out His Spirit upon us, making us His body and allowing us to participate in His atonement, His death and rebirth, and His bodily ascension to the Father. We are His Church, not because of some name or organizational chart, but because He shares His Spirit with us. Continue to pray for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, inviting Him into your heart, and asking for grace upon grace for all His holy people.

"Behold I am doing a new thing! Now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? Isaiah 43:19.

By Michael D. O'Brien



Michael O'Brien presents a thrilling apocalyptic novel about the condition of the Roman Catholic Church at the end of time. It explores the state of the modern world, and the strengths and weaknesses of the contemporary religious scene, by taking his central character, Father Elijah Schafer, a Carmelite priest, on a secret mission for the Vatican which embroils him in a series of crises and subterfuges affecting the ultimate destiny of the Church.

In this richly textured tale, Father Elijah crosses Europe and the Middle East, moves through the echelons of world power, meets saints and sinners, presidents, judges, mystics, embattled Catholic journalists, faithful priests and a conspiracy of traitors within the very House of God. This is an apocalypse in the old literary sense, but one that was written in the light of Christian revelation.

Helena - a novel that Evelyn Waugh considered to be his favorite, and most ambitious, work - deftly traverses the forces of corruption, treachery, enlightenment and political intrigue of Imperial Rome as it brings to life an inspiring heroine.

Scripture of the Week

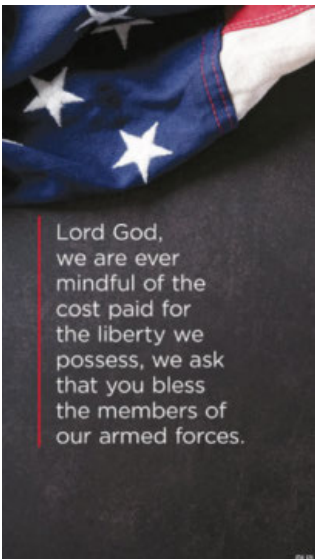


"Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them." (Acts 2:3)

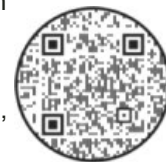

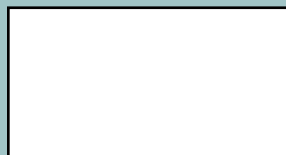
