## Called to Communion

Last November, I had the blessing to visit France with a couple of priest friends. One of our stops was Notre-Dame Cathedral in Paris, where we gazed on the magnificent façade with its intricate and beautiful carvings that were created around 800 years ago. The original edifice, which took 180 years to build, was under construction again to rebuild the parts of the structure that had been damaged by the fire in April 2019. It was an impressive scene, with many cranes and people all working together.

The experience made me wonder about all those who started building the Cathedral almost 900 years ago. I started to reflect on the all the efforts made and all the talents shared to create such a beautiful structure. One thing is sure: To create something beautiful requires effort, vision and sacrifice.

At Holy Name of Jesus, the beginning of our mission statement reads that we share in the Body of Christ. Sharing in the Body of Christ means that we have been baptized in Christ and together, as members of His Body, Jesus shares with us His relationship to the Father. His Body is the New Temple, and while Jesus is the cornerstone, we are the living stones that are constructed into a Holy Temple. While Notre Dame is beautiful, it is meant to signify the beauty of the New Temple of Christ's Body, the Church, whose beauty surpasses any physical structure.

Thus, to manifest the magnificent reality that the **Body of Christ** is, we are **Called to Communion**. Sharing in the Body of Christ means that we not only receive from the goodness and beauty of the Body present here at Holy Name of Jesus, but we are called to be a contributing member of this Body. Without our contribution, the Body would be lacking the gift intended for it by God, who gave us the gift in the first place to be a blessing to the Body. To quote 1 Chronicles 12:14, "But who am I, and who are my people, that we should have the means to contribute so freely? For everything is from you, and what we give is what we have from you."

How is God calling you to make this local Temple, the Body of Christ, good and beautiful? Together, we have accomplished so much this year. The Lord blessed us with a great team of dedicated employees and volunteers who are working on even bigger long-term plans for our church, cemetery and school. Imagine the amazing things we could accomplish for God's glory if every household increased their support by just 6%!

During our **fall stewardship invitation "Called to Communion" that starts on Oct. 12-13**, we invite you to take time to reflect on your gifts of prayer, participation and generosity. We are reminded that all we have is from God and He asks us to glorify Him through our stewarding of the gifts He has given us. I ask that you prayerfully consider increasing your generosity, whether it is in sharing your talents, your resources or your time with our parish family.

Like the many people who contributed to the magnificent structure that became Notre Dame Cathedral, may our generosity with the Lord here at Holy Name of Jesus allow us to be built into a holy and living Temple that magnifies the glory of the Lord.

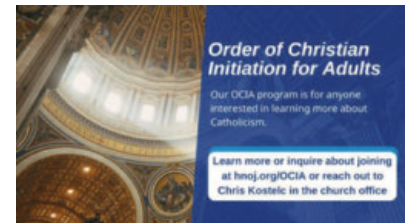
## OCIA


