Ascension Outreach Weekend, Feb. 1-2

"Long-term partners in caring for each other."

That's how Dr. Nancy Norling describes the relationship between Holy Name of Jesus (HNOJ) and Ascension. She attended grade school at HNOJ and has volunteered at Ascension for years.

"I heard Michael O'Connell (previous Ascension pastor) speak at a Mass at HNOJ, thanking HNOJ for their partnership in supporting Ascension School," recalls Norling. "He was so passionate about the school and the scholars I wanted to go find out more.

"I've met many great friends, who opened my eyes to reach outside my bubble to see a world I knew little about," adds Norling. "Fr. Dale (Korogi, Ascension pastor) and Ascension parishioners are passionate about helping the less fortunate, those living in poverty and suffering from racial injustice."

As a dentist, Norling has helped lead "Ready, Set, Smile," a program that brings dentists into schools like Ascension to provide free dental care. In fact, one of her favorite memories of volunteering at Ascension came during one of the "Ready, Set, Smile" visits.

"One of the little girls invited me to come for dinner that night," remembers Norling. "The girl said: 'My mom makes the best spaghetti ... and I know she won't care if you come."

What makes that relationship between HNOJ so strong? "I think realizing that each parish has so many gifts to share," says Norling. "Not just financially, but also the gifts of time and talent. And of course, prayer."

Ascension Catholic School - A Beacon of Hope

Ascension Catholic School, an important presence in North Minneapolis for more than 125 years, helps move lives forward through education and spiritual formation.

Currently, 96% of the 272 scholars K-8 at Ascension Catholic School are children of color; 68% meet federal guidelines to qualify for free or reduced lunch, which is a marker for poverty; and 17% are learning to speak English as a second language. For the past several years, nearly 100% of Ascension 8th graders have received their high school diplomas in four years, with a vast majority going on to college.

Your Support is Vital to Ascension's Success

Ascension Catholic School needs our partnership more than ever to build on their past success. In fact, 95% of Ascension's general operating revenue is generated through sponsorships, individual donations, grant funding and second collection efforts. Roughly 4% comes from tuition and fees paid by families.



New Musical Mass Setting

Mother Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that fully conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy. Such participation by the Christian people as 'a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people' (1 Pet. 2:9; cf. 2:4-5), is their right and duty by reason of their baptism.

As Holy Name of Jesus begins a new liturgical year, it is with enthusiasm that we begin a new Mass setting on Feb. 8-9, 2025. Composer Kevin Keil's Mass of **St. Frances Cabrini** was published to be approachable and realistic for Catholic parishes across the country. Composed to appeal to all sorts of musical styles and skill sets, this Mass can be played on the guitar, organ and piano. It most importantly is set in a realistic vocal range and can be meditative yet celebratory and festive!

Throughout this Mass setting, Kevin Keil has masterfully woven together a series of recurring chants in the Gregorian tradition with melodic themes that are easy to learn and easy to remember. Easily scalable, it can be as big or small as you need it to be, with a variety of instrumental accompaniments (including handbells).

Besides complete accompaniment parts for various instruments, supplemental solo instrumental parts only add to the quality of the musical writing. The Mass of **Saint Frances Cabrini** can also be used in combination with a five-part brass ensemble, string quartet or timpani accompaniment. Whatever the size/tambor of the given Holy Name of Jesus liturgy, you are sure to find a deeper connection to Christ through this celebratory yet contemplative Mass setting.






