Going Deeper this Lent @LPI

Question: Lent always seems to help me renew my relationship with God and strengthen my religious practice. Do you have any suggestions as to what I could do to achieve that the rest of the year?



Answer: The obvious answer may

seem to be to do whatever you do during Lent all year round. But part of the power of Lent is that we focus as a community on renewing our faith and preparing for Easter. Our Lenten practices have a purpose and a goal. Therein lies the secret. When we focus our efforts on one virtue, or try to change one bad habit, or seek to deepen our understanding of one aspect of faith, we focus our efforts and give our full attention to what we are trying to accomplish. We tend to be more successful achieving our goals. More importantly, it has a ripple effect in our lives: one thing changes or is added to the spiritual mix of our lives and many aspects are changed.


All too often we leave our spiritual growth to chance and the practice of faith to habit, and then wonder why we have no sense of growth or progress. Think of it in terms of exercise. We walk, lift weights, bend and stretch to attain the maximum benefit from what we do. In addition, to keep those benefits, we eat healthful food and get enough vitamins and rest. Spirituality requires the same kind of attention: we pray, fast, read the Bible, receive Sacraments and do charitable work to maximize the benefits of practicing faith. Scripture of the Week




"He said to him, 'My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found. " (Luke 15:31-32)

Our Gospel in Liturgical Year C today recounts the familiar story of the prodigal son. This story is our story. For some, we are in a relationship with God that allows us to live our lives as the father in the story - always watching for those we love to return and welcoming them when they do. For some, we are the older son, trying to live our lives faithfully and yet still caught up in anger or confusion or hurt when we perceive others seemingly getting more than what we see as their fair share. For some we are the younger son, living our lives and making mistakes, but with time and grace seeing our errors, our faults and seeking to return to a better way of living.

Regardless of who we are in this story, how far we've wandered, how long we've toiled and still feel lost, the road home is always as short as turning towards Him and taking just the first step. God is ALWAYS waiting and watching for that invitation of our first movement home. This parable is the only place in all Sacred Scripture that depicts God running. Imagine that. The only time God runs is towards us when we but turn towards Him.


