Vacation Bible School - Come, Holy Spirit!

Are your kids ready for the BEST week of the summer?! VBS registration for 2025 is now open! Please check our VBS website at hnoj.org/vbs for the registration form. Our theme this year is *Come, Holy Spirit!* VBS takes place at Holy Name of Jesus June 9-12, from 8:30 a.m.-Noon.

What is VBS?

Vacation Bible School is a special four-day faith-filled AND fun-filled time to kick off the summer and get closer to the Lord. Open to kids ages four through 5th grade (entering 5th grade in the fall of 2025). Kids will have the opportunity to make friends, craft, sing, play games, pray and learn about God's love, with the Holy Spirit as our guide. Children who will be four in the fall and are potty trained are eligible to register at the preschool level. Each day, participants will spend time at four centers designed to help see and feel the role of the Holy Spirit in the Bible, the Church and our lives, all in a child-friendly way. How much does it cost to attend to VBS?

The cost is \$50 per participant. Any registrations received after May 9 will be charged a \$5 late fee. Our registration deadline is May 26.

Vacation Bible School volunteers needed!

With that, we can't have Vacation Bible School without volunteers! We need energetic and faith-filled teens and adults who would like to share their love of Christ with the participants by volunteering to lead them through the week.

Teens who are entering 6th grade and older are invited to apply to serve as a VBS volunteer. Applications are online at hnoj.org/vbs. **Applications will be due by May 15!** Those who have applied will be contacted via email within a week of receiving the application to inform you if your application has been accepted.

Adults who are 18 years of age can register online to serve as a volunteer by

using the Adult Volunteer Form found at hnoj.org/vbs. We are seeking adults to serve as leaders in the various VBS Centers. Adults are also needed to serve as Group Leaders and Nurses. Look for more information about all the volunteer roles at hnoj.org/vbs. Parent volunteers will receive free tuition for one child attending VBS.

May Homily Series

Throughout this year, we have responded to Archbishop's invitation to implement the second focus area of his pastoral letter, specifically, to become more engaged in our participation of the Eucharistic sacrifice at Mass, with all that surrounds it, and to grow in devotion to the Eucharist. One way we responded to this invitation was to have a homily series on the Mass, of which Part 1 was this past Fall. Following Easter, we are implementing Part 2 of that homily series and will be reflecting on the following topics:

- May 3-4: The Eucharistic Prayer
- May 10-11: Behold the Lamb of God and Adoration
- May 17-18: The time of Holy Communion Preparation and what we do when we receive
- May 24-25: The Our Father and the Sign of Peace
- May 31-June 1: Go forth, the Mass is ended How we live what we have just celebrated

The goal of these is to grow in our understanding of these sacred times and actions of Mass and how we are actively engaged in our participation. What will assist us in our reflection will be the readings at Mass, in particular the cycle of readings from the book of Revelation that comprise our second readings. These passages give us a glimpse into what we call the "heavenly liturgy", the eternal praise and worship of God taking place in heaven. Many responses or prayers we say at Mass are taken from the passages that we will be hearing, which is a reminder to us that when we are participating at Mass, our worship of God is joined to the praise of God in heaven by all the saints and angels.

May the Lord bless our efforts to appreciate and understand this marvelous gift so that we might offer more fitting worship to God and be sanctified by our sacrifice of praise.



Tuesday Morning Group Elijah in Jerusalem

Elijah in Jerusalem, the long-awaited sequel to the acclaimed, best-selling novel Father Elijah: An Apocalypse, is the continuing story of the Catholic priest called to confront a powerful politician who could be the Antichrist foretold in the Bible. In this sequel, now-Bishop Elijah, wanted for a murder he did not commit, tries again to meet the President. Accompanied by his fellow monk Brother Enoch, he enters Jerusalem just as the President arrives in the holy city to inaugurate a new stage of his rise to world power. This time Elijah hopes to unmask him as a spiritual danger to mankind. As the story unfolds, people of various backgrounds meet the fugitive priest, and in the encounter their souls are revealed and tested.



Elijah perseveres in his mission even when all seems lost. The dramatic climax is surprising, yet it underlines that God works all things to the good for those who love him.

Parishioners stay in-the-know through a monthly print newsletter and e-newsletter about our community and our faith. To receive e-news, sign up on our website at hnoi.org.




