Mother's Day Reflection

Relationships can be difficult, and the relationships between parents and children are often the top of those that cause angst. A few years ago, I started to notice a trend where businesses that rely on web traffic would offer patrons the opportunity to opt out of emails related to certain holidays or occasions. I first remember seeing it pop up a few weeks before the yearly barrage of ads announcing specials and sales for Father's Day. The following year, I noticed the same thing for Mother's Day. I grew



up a Generation X product of the 70s and 80s, so far be it from me to argue the merits or drawbacks of trigger warnings and safe spaces, but it struck me as peculiar that society had all of a sudden become particularly sensitive to the hurts and grief of consumers that it made sense to give them the chance to be free from the offers for 25% off perfumes and colognes or BOGO lawn and garden tools for mom or pop. Still, I have lost a parent that I loved, but with a love mixed with difficult and conflicted feelings, and yet I still know all too well the longing that accompanies commercials shouting, "Doesn't your dad deserve a steak?" Even 20 years later I think, "Yes. I think he does."

For many people, it is through the relationship with their parents where they will live out the biological realities of birth and death in its fullness - your parents (your mother at least) were there when you were born, and often you, the child, are there when your parents pass on. Of course, there are many people whose experiences don't fit with this model. Still, it is consistent and common enough to be a generally recognizable pattern. To add to this, the moment we enter into the world and the moment we leave, end up becoming the most profound memories we have as parents and children. For parents, our children exist in a state of perpetual infancy (they grow up so fast...I remember that like it was just yesterday) and our parents have always been old (why was my mom so much older at age 50 than I am?)

Maybe it is a coincidence, or maybe serendipity, but regardless, it is perfect timing that during the month we honor moms we also celebrate our beloved Mother Mary. What a joy to know that when we pray the Hail Mary, we are seeking the assistance of a mother that never ages and is always available.

Sunday School is for ages three through Kindergarten and meets during the 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. Masses.


For 1st to 5th grades, we offer Faith Formation Wednesday night

sessions from 4:45-6 p.m. or 6:15-7:30 p.m.


Students in the 2nd grade typically prepare for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Communion through the First Sacraments program.


Summer Drop-In Small Groups
