## Habemus Papam!

Habemus Papam! We have a Pope! Undoubtedly by now you are aware of the election of Pope Leo XIV to the Chair of Peter. As Catholics all over the world celebrated his election, seemingly everyone scrambled to learn as much as possible about this Cardinal from Chicago. This is how things went down at HNOJ.

I had the live video feed of the Sistine Chapel Chimney on in the background of my computer screen. I knew at about 10:30 a.m. a vote was scheduled and I wanted to be prepared. Tim Lyngdal, our Coordinator of Mission, was sitting in one of the chairs in the office when Sarah Reid, HNOJ's Communications Coordinator, stepped into my office to ask a question. We got chatting about the Conclave when I saw it:

A baby seagull.

On the video feed of the most famous chimney in the world a family of seagulls had landed on the roof much to the delight of the crowd. The fluffy grey bird seemed oblivious to cheers for it erupting from St. Peter's square. I told Sarah and Tim about the baby bird and said they should come look. They came around to my side of the desk to see it and only a moment later we saw something else - white smoke.

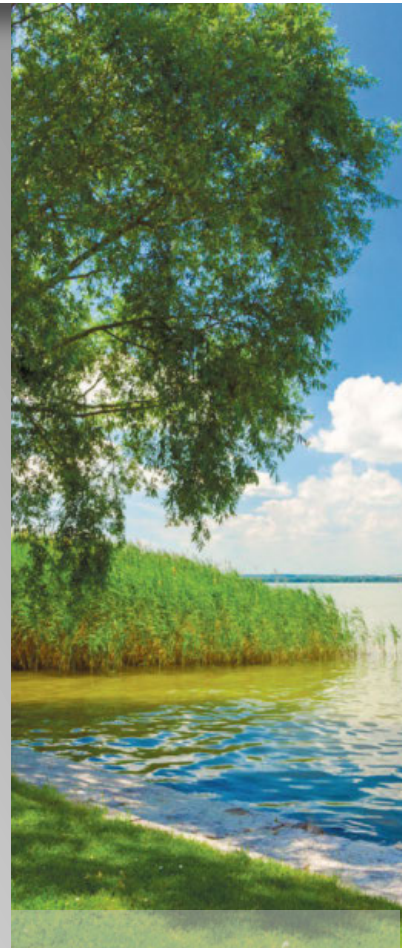
At first I couldn't believe it. I couldn't tell if it truly was white or if that was just the sun and the angle of the camera. The roar of the crowd convinced me that indeed white smoke was emerging and we knew a new pope had been elected. We rushed to Emmaus to watch him emerge on the loggia and be introduced to the world.

One person in my household has been more excited than most about the name our new Pope has chosen. His holiness, Leo the first grader, has cheered every time his and Pope Leo's name has been mentioned on the news, in conversation, or at an all school prayer assembly. My wife shared that some of her coworkers found it amazing she was able to predict the name of the next Pope in naming her son Leo. My wife's explanation that our Leo was named for past Popes was met with mostly blank stares.

Pope Leo XIV has shared that he chose the name in reference to Pope Leo XIII who reigned from 1878-1903. Pope Leo XIII is known for the promulgations of two encyclicals. In 1879 at the beginning of his papacy Pope Leo XIII wrote *Aeterni Patris* which encouraged the study of St. Thomas Aquinas and renewed interest in Thomistic thinking and philosophy in the Church. Trust me when I say, this was and is a big deal and we have Leo XIII to thank.

More famously, Pope Leo XIII promulgated *Rarum Novarum* at the beginning of the Industrial Revolution in 1891. *Rarum Novarum* outlines the social teachings of the Church. He touches upon the right to a fair wage, safe working conditions, trade unions, right to property and free enterprise, and opposes both socialism and unfettered capitalism. *Rarum Novarum* has been a hugely influential work and has done much to recognize the dignity of every single human person.

Pope Leo XIII was also known as the "Rosary Pope," having issued eleven encyclicals on the rosary. He had a beautiful Marian devotion and established the Leonise prayers that were prayed after the end of Mass from 1884 until 1964 (look them up if you don't know them). Leo XIII also wrote the St. Michael the Archangel prayer which many Catholics continue to say after the end of Mass.

Pope Leo XIII also strongly advocated for the Scholastic idea that science and religion should rightly coexist and refounded the Vatican Observatory. He held the fourth longest papacy. Pope Leo XIII was a regular guy doing a wildly important job under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

The same is true of Pope Leo XIV. He is a White Sox fan. He plays tennis. He is likely the pope who has eaten the largest number of hot dogs. He holds an incredibly important job. He is the Holy Father (pope comes from papa or dad). He is Pontifex Maximus (bridge builder). He is the Servant of the Servants of God. He needs our prayers. Please stop whatever you are doing and say a Hail Mary for Leo XIV our Pope.

*Elijah in Jerusalem*, the long-awaited sequel to the acclaimed, best-selling novel *Father Elijah: An Apocalypse*, is the continuing story of the Catholic priest called to confront a powerful politician who could be the Antichrist foretold in the Bible. In this sequel, now-Bishop Elijah, wanted for a murder he did not commit, tries again to meet the President. Accompanied by his fellow monk, Brother Enoch, he enters Jerusalem just as the President arrives in the holy city to inaugurate a new stage of his rise to world power. This time Elijah hopes to unmask him as a spiritual danger to mankind. As the story unfolds, people of various backgrounds meet the fugitive priest, and in the encounter their souls are revealed and tested.

Elijah perseveres in his mission even when all seems lost. The dramatic climax is surprising, yet it underlines that God works all things to the good for those who love Him.

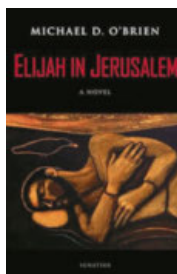
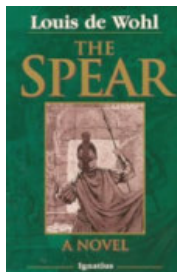
*The Spear: A novel of the Crucifixion*

## Grateful for You: How Your Support is Building Our Future

As we near the end of our fiscal year on June 30, 2025, we are happy to share how your generosity is making an impact at Holy Name of Jesus.

We are pleased to report that our 2024 annual audit was a success - a testament to the thoughtful stewardship of our parish and school leadership, along with the strong guidance and oversight of the Parish Council and Finance Council. As of April, general operating expenses stand at \$867,000, which is 4% under budget and 2% lower than last year. Facilities expenses have remained steady at \$370,000, even with rising costs. We have also invested over \$600,000 into major long-term capital improvements such as a new classroom addition, school air conditioning, roofing, HVAC (heating) automation and more to improve the carbon footprint of our building. This June, we will begin remodeling the bathrooms in the cafeteria area, and we opted to prepay for materials to avoid tariff surcharges.

Our ministry and faith formation efforts are thriving, with expenses 6% under budget at \$1.2 million. With a fully staffed team, we have been able to continue to grow our small groups, youth ministry, men's ministry and so much more that brings life to our parish.

Your generosity has kept collections strong at \$2.9 million since July 1, 2024. Because of your generosity, we are able to offer strong summer ministry programming, community outreach, facility improvements and cemetery development. We are especially thankful for the incredible response to our Called to Communion stewardship invitation. Your prayers, engagement and financial gifts sustain everything we do. In June, we will send pledge statements to those who pledged.

To make giving easier, consider setting up electronic donations or explore options like Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) from IRA accounts or stock donations for potential tax advantages. Including HNOJ in your estate plans is a powerful way to leave a lasting legacy of faith. ## Holy Name of Jesus Parish Mass Intention Policies



The practice of requesting a priest to offer Mass for loved ones, living or deceased, is an ancient and beautiful practice of our Catholic tradition. At Holy Name of Jesus Parish, Mass can be offered for a deceased loved one and going forward we will also allow Mass to be offered for living loved ones too. Since there are a limited number of opportunities for Mass intentions, the following policies are being implemented to accommodate the numerous requests offered to the Catholic faithful in a reasonable and fair manner.

Pastors of the parishes are obliged to apply a Mass for the people (*Pro Populo*) entrusted to them each Sunday and holy day of obligation (Code of Canon Law, 534). This means that every weekend and holy day of obligation, a Mass is offered for the members of Holy Name of Jesus Parish.

Furthermore, universal Church discipline as contained in the 1983 Code of Canon Law (canons 945-958) strictly regulates the offerings made for the celebration of Mass.

Therefore, please note the following guidelines for Mass intention requests:

1. Masses can be said for any living or deceased person.
2. To ensure consistent and fair opportunity for all desiring an intention for a loved one, we can schedule no more than seven Masses per year from each donor or for an intention.
3. The stipend (suggested offering) is \$7 as determined by diocesan policy.
4. Masses may be scheduled no more than 12 months in advance from date of request.
5. Requests will be honored on a first-come, first-serve basis in the order in which the request is received in the parish office.
  - A. Mass requests will be granted as close to the requested date and time as possible.
  - B. If it is not possible to comply with the primary date requested, the next closest date and time will be scheduled, and the parishioner will be notified.
6. Mass requests can be made in person at the parish office, or via postal mail, email, or over the phone.
7. Two Masses every Sunday will be scheduled for the parishioners of Holy Name of Jesus known as the Pro Populo ("For the People") intention.
8. SPECIAL DAYS: Mass intentions *cannot* be scheduled for Holy Thursday (*Pro Populo*) or Easter Vigil (OCIA Candidates).
9. In the event of an unforeseen circumstance where a Mass cancellation occurs, the intention for the Mass will be rescheduled for the next available opening and the parishioner will be notified.
10. Holy Name of Jesus reserves the right to review a Mass intention and determine how the intention is printed.
11. There is no guarantee that the Mass intention will be announced at Mass, as the Mass intention mainly pertains to designating the presider's offering of the Mass.
