Today we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, the day when the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the Apostles. Of all the major feast days in the life of the Church, the Feast of Pentecost falls third in the order of importance (the first being Easter and the second being Christmas). As with the other major feasts, the Feast of Pentecost is preceded by a liturgical season. Just like Lent leads up to Easter and Advent leads up to Christmas, so too the liturgical season of Easter leads up to Pentecost, and indeed, this Easter season of joy actually culminates and finds its fulfillment and purpose in Pentecost.



After the resurrection, the disciples experienced great joy in the reality that Jesus had conquered death and had purchased for us eternal life in Him. And yet, even with all that they had seen and witnessed, in the midst of such a powerful reality, they remained fearful of sharing and living that reality. Their hearts were not capable of interiorizing this great mystery.

Last week, during the Ascension, we heard Jesus tell His disciples that He would send the Advocate to them, to strengthen them with power from on high. This power would give them the strength they needed to live out their faith in the world. And not only live it out, but to do so with eagerness and joy, and to share it with others.

We all need the Holy Spirit in our lives if we want to authentically live out our faith. So I encourage you this week to say the "Come Holy Spirit" prayer every morning, asking the Holy Spirit to be poured out upon you, upon your family and upon His Church, so that you might be strengthened in Faith, Hope and Love, to not live in timidity or fear of the judgement of others, but that you might have joy in living out the gospel of life. May the peace of Christ remain with you always.

#### Prayer:

"Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Thy faithful, and enkindle in them the fire of Thy love. Send forth Your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. Let us pray. O God, Who didst instruct the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant us in the same Spirit to be truly wise, and ever to rejoice in His consolation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen"


