

# Scripture of the Week



"But when He comes, the Spirit of Truth, He will guide you to all truth." (John 16:13)

Just as Christmas celebrates
Jesus's descent to earth, we
see the descent of the Holy
Spirit celebrated each year on
Pentecost. And each year, the
Church gives us the gift of
Trinity Sunday the week after
Pentecost. All three Persons of
the Most Holy Trinity have now
been revealed to humanity.
Each year, this gift of knowing
the Trinity strikes fear into the
hearts of homilists as they
strive to speak of the mystery of
the Most Holy Trinity in ways



that reveal the reality without minimalizing the mystery in the process.

It's a difficult task as, seemingly, we are told that in this one instance 1 + 1 + 1 = 1, not 3. Our minds struggle to grasp the mystery in human terms. St. Augustine taught, "You see the Trinity if you see love." He taught that the Father is the Lover, the Son is the Loved One and the Holy Spirit is the personification of the very act of loving. Our readings today contain the theme of pouring out. This love of the Lover to the Loved One is not stingy or a partial thing. Rather it is poured out from the entirety of The Most Holy Trinity, and it is done so for us.

May expectant fathers lovingly support the mothers of their children in welcoming new life; We pray to the Lord:


For expectant fathers: May they find courage in the example of St. Joseph, as they prepare to love, protect and provide for their child; We pray to the Lord:




