The Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus

a growing appetite. If this hunger cannot be filled by the world, how can it be filled?

Today's Solemnity, Corpus Christi, tells us how. Corpus Christi celebrates the fact that Jesus is truly present Body, Soul and Divinity in the Eucharist. symbols of these, but a true and literal physical presence of each His Body, His Blood, His Soul and His Divinity. This teaching has been with us since the Church came into being at the time of Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection.

Our readings today all focus on this mystery of bread and wine being so much more. Beginning with our reading from Genesis where we see Melchizedek, described as "a priest of God Most High" offering bread and wine, continuing with the oldest recorded words of consecration in St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, up to the miraculous feeding of the 5,000 by Jesus after blessing "five loaves and two fish" but having twelve baskets of leftovers. We focus on the superabundance of Christ's *gift* to each of us. A gift that we receive each time we go to Communion. His *gift* of Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity.
