True Rest

Our world is such a busy place, and our calendars quickly fill up with work, shopping, sporting events, vacations, house projects, birthday parties, meal prep, and many other things. And when we do get a break, when we are confronted with a moment of silence, we often get trapped in the thought that "I'm not accomplishing enough", and we frantically look for something to fill our time, or the ever present phone seems to always linger at our fingertips, never allowing us to have that moment to breath, that moment to simply be, to rest and be refreshed. It's important to remember that "we are human beings, not human doings" (Rick Warren).

Because the world expects so much from us, we often measure our own worth by what we can do or accomplish. But it's important to remember that God doesn't love us because of what we can do or accomplish. Instead, He loves us simply because we are. He loves us simply because we exist and belong to Him, like a child resting in its parents arms who has done nothing to deserve their love. And yet, their love is palpable. Are we taking the time to soak in this love from our creator?

God created leisure and rest for us because He knew we needed it. "And God rested on the seventh day from all the work he had done." (Genesis 2:2). Or as Jesus tells us, "The sabbath was made for man, not man for the sabbath" (Mark 2:27). How are we at entering into this rest and being refreshed by it, especially on Sunday?

It starts by how we approach the activities in our life. Leisure, which is different from laziness, involves doing something for its own sake, not because it helps you to accomplish something else or because it needs to be done, but simply because you enjoy it, simply because it is true, good, and beautiful. Read a

book, not for study, but because it captivates you. Go for a walk or exercise, not because you want to get in shape but because it is lifegiving to you. Paint an art project or do woodworking, not because you want others to see it, but simply for the joy of creating something with your own hands.

As we approach the final month of summer, ask yourself, am I taking enough time to simply be, to rest in existence itself, allowing the love of God to fill my life with joy and peace? Because it is by entering into His rest that we can then truly thrive.





The Difference Makers Retreat: Called to Love, Called to Serve

A few weeks ago, we heard the Gospel story of the Good Samaritan. In it, Jesus reminds us of the Great Commandment: to love God with all our heart, mind, and soul – and to love our neighbor as ourselves. He then tells a striking parable: a Samaritan, from a different tribe and religious tradition, sees a wounded man in a ditch and chooses compassion. Though separated by belief and background, he recognizes a neighbor in need and comes to his aid.

This Gospel reminds us that faith is not just an interior journey with God – it's also a call outward, into the world. It's a call to servanthood.

Servanthood is the heart of an upcoming half-day, interdenominational Christian retreat called *The Difference Makers*, to be held Saturday afternoon, Nov. 8, at Plymouth Playhouse. Through music, witness talks, guided discussion, and audience interaction, we'll explore four key questions:

- Who is God?
- Who am I?
- Where's the need?
- What's my call?


