Scripture of the Week



"Prepare a full account of your stewardship, because you can no longer be my steward." (Luke 16:2b)

Our First Reading and Gospel today focus on deceivers, cheating, and using the ways of this world to try and "get ahead." More interestingly, the deceiver in our Gospel, the steward about to get fired for stealing from his master, ends up being praised by his master for cheating! Huh??? This is perhaps best understood as beginning to make "baby steps" towards the path of righteousness. What the steward does is show mercy to those who owe debts to his master. Although his principal motive is for himself, this marks the first time his cheating was not all about him.

Now he realizes that others owe debts, and while technically not his to forgive, he shows mercy to them so that they may show mercy to him in the future. Sometimes the first step for many of us is to first get outside our own head, to start thinking about the "other." This is what God asks, that we acknowledge and care for the other. Recognizing that there is an "other" is the first step. Yes, the motives are still selfish with this steward, but can that also be the case in our own lives at times? We are called to enter into the life, the very person of Jesus - when we let go of our personal motives and surrender to the will of the Father, we are well on the way.


God and Mammon




